She has served as a member on the NASBE National Conference Planning Committee. She has also been an active member of the South Carolina Alliance of Black School Educators. As the President of SCABSE @ Lowcountry and a member of the Executive Board, Nikki's goals are to illuminate the challenges of Black teachers and administrators and find areas of collaboration across constituent groups.

In 2025, Nikki joined our Doctor of Education program, which focuses on learning and inquiry in practice. This program is designed to support workforce development in our region and the state. Graduates of our program will collaborate and communicate effectively with others and improve the efficiency of their current work environment. In a short time, Nikki has made a considerable impact in our program. She is an active member of our cohort, always interrogating systems of power, privilege, and access. She is well poised to grow and mature as a leader and action researcher while in this program. These are the types of skills and dispositions a recipient of the Dr. Charles Mitchell, Jr. Leadership Scholarship should embody.
